Meeting local needs for new housing

The Parish Council and the landowners have been considering two



small scale housing developments in Graveley to meet local housing needs, primarily for market housing but also including some affordable homes for rent that may be available to our community. The developments would allow for some natural growth in our community and should allow households now living in family homes too large for their current needs to 'downsize' within the same village. Our vision is one of well designed houses within quality green surroundings. Planning permission will be required for the development of the houses allowing for local opinion and taking into account plan policies and the merits of the proposal.

We are also proposing a new public green area for the benefit of the village which we currently lack.

The sites we have identified are shown on the maps inside. We have proposed these sites to South Cambridgeshire District Council (SCDC) for inclusion in their new Local Plan and think that most local people will be supportive.

However the new Local Plan does not currently include any housing allocations in smaller villages like Graveley, preferring to provide new housing in new settlements or in larger better served villages. Before SCDC could lend support to our aspirations under the spirit of localism, it will need written evidence of whether there is a majority of local support for them in the community. Please take a little time to look at the proposed sites and answer the questions. Once you have filled the response form in and signed it you can deliver it to one of your Parish Councillors or post or email it to your Parish Council Clerk. If you have any queries please send them to Tess Rogers the Parish Clerk.


We intend to submit the results of the consultation to SCDC to support our comments on the Local Plan which have proposed these sites for housing development and as a public green area.

In principle we at 87 Toseland Rd, Graveley agree with both proposals for development at Manor Farm and Toseland Road.

Comments as follows:-

1. We notice that the Manor Farm site is over 3x larger than Toseland Rd, but only up to 12 houses are proposed at Manor Farm whereas up to 6 houses are proposed at Toseland Rd, surely to ensure fairness for developers and residents either the number of proposed dwelling is reduced at Toseland Road, to say 4 (this is our preferred option), or the number of dwellings is increased, to say 18 at Manor Farm.

2. In light of the almost constant flooding of the road, near Duck End farm, instead of the proposed green area, the money is spent building a Ford similar to the one at Hilton or on additional traffic calming measures especially along Toseland Rd where vehicles regularly exceed the 30 MPH speed limit (I believe figures from speedwatch can back this up).

3. There are AM noise issues from the Wind Farm, if this is allowed to continue (HDC & SCDC EHO's are undertaking an exercise at present to access the level of AM noise impacts local residents have been suffering for many months now) the developers are made aware of this fact as it is likely to affect their ability to sell their properties.

4. For Toseland Rd, consideration is given to those houses most affected i.e. those either side of the warehouse compound, to maintain the levels of privacy (no overlooked gardens) that are afforded today.

Meeting local needs for new housing

Dear Keith,

I have just received the communication from Graveley PC and the landowners about meeting local needs for new housing. As I read the document, Graveley PC has already approached SCDC which suggests that it (the PC), as well as the landowners, are in favour of this proposal, an implication which appals me, not least because of the conclusions which may be drawn. I feel let down by those who are supposed to represent me. The reasons given for this, of natural growth (does that mean anything?) and desire to downsize are clearly both rubbish. We do not live in a village where the so-called bedroom tax is an issue and I have never heard of anyone wanting to downsize here.

Graveley seems to be up for grabs. We already have a wind farm which has been built against the vast majority of local opinion. We are shortly to experience continuous background noise from the new A14 motorway which is to be built very close to this village. We have no amenities – a reason which, according to a local source, has meant that no-one on the council housing list wants to move here. Speaking personally, I have already seen the value of our house reduce, but the building of the 12 house development directly opposite as proposed would be the final straw. I have a long memory and the landowner of the field on which the 12 house development is proposed has already tried this before (although in a different place) – together with the sweetener of a "green space". It was roundly thrown out by the village, but then the PC was not in favour.

The reasons it was refused then have not changed. Graveley has insufficient infra-structure to support more housing. The high street is not wide enough, nor in good enough condition, to take the additional traffic, it would worry me that more cars would be using the road, especially so close to the bend where accidents happen regularly. The fact that there are no buses militates against the building of social housing (a legal requirement for a development like this) and, added to the known fact that tenants do not want to move here (for obvious reasons) makes me wonder just what would happen to those houses. Would we just get the nuisance families who are moved from more extensive council estates? It would, of course, permanently change the nature of the village. The houses would be crowded next to each other (the space is quite small, it will hardly be a Setchell's Close type development), very different from the majority of the houses in Graveley, which is considered by some to be quite pretty.

There are, currently, at least four houses in the village which have been on the market for over a year which makes a nonsense of any so-called need for new housing. I have no reason for thinking that a new development would be any more successful in finding occupants for its houses especially given the proximity to the wind farm (the 6 house development is probably within 1000 meters), unless, of course, the price of the houses is so low that they seem good value. It could then also attract "buy to rent" purchasers with similar possible consequences. The effect on the purchase price of other houses in the village, already hit by the wind farm effects, would be incalculable.

What is proposed is, I suggest, against the interests of most of the residents of this village – with one or two very obvious exceptions. I certainly will be voting against it.

As a final comment, I am finding it very difficult to understand precisely what sort of village the PC wants to see. Not so very long ago there was a proposal to get rid of the village hall, the only meeting place in the village. Now there is a proposal to enlarge the village by building 18 new houses, potentially 72 more people. They would have nowhere to go to meet new people, except the pub or the church. This all seems rather contradictory to me.

While a small increase in the population is no bad thing, the village needs serious improvements in several areas to make it a desirable place to live, until these are met I cannot see how further development will do anything but place further strain on the current situation.

Water run off - there is a major problem with flooding around the two ponds, this needs resolving ahead of any further building work affecting run off and the water table.

Internet - The current system is shared across the village resulting in capped allowances and appalling speeds, adding to the number of users will probably stop it altogether. There is currently no date set to upgrade the village to Fibre Optic or even a standard Broadband speed. Encouraging cable operators to come to the village would be another solution.

Bus route - as far as I know there is only one bus that comes through the village on a Saturday. I can't see how such a complete lack of public transport would be appealing to any house buyer.

Papworth Rd Speeding - Cars accelerate down the hill out of the village, clearly breaking the 30mph speed limit before they have passed the final house or reached the de-restricted signpost. If the Manor Farm houses have access on this part of the road then an accident is more likely. Traffic calming (rumble strips perhaps or those white village gates) at the entrance to the village and moving the de-restricted sign post round the bend would help.

The Toseland road sit is more suitable location but its position opposite the lorry works and windfarm may make it difficult to sell.

Reference the recent 'flyer' regarding the housing proposal for the village of Graveley. I could not attend the open meeting on the 23rd Jan. I did speak to several people who did attend and was advised of the varying opinions of villagers given at the meeting.

Com hander

First, I will register my response to the questions on the paper.Question 1 Manor FarmNOQuestion 2 Toseland RoadNO

My answers need qualifying. However, before I do I must comment on the way the flyer was composed. Fortunately I attended the last PC meeting and it seemed to me than the council members were careful in not specifically promoting the development proposals. I was very surprised to see the wording in the flyer which seemed to intimate the opposite. The first line, states, 'The parish council and the landowners are considering two small scale(?) housing developments to meet local housing needs.' Unquote.

This reads to me (and others I have spoken to) the landowners and the PC HAVE AGREED to promote the developments TOGETHER. The PC and land owners should not have been grouped together in the same sentence in such a way. It would have been more acceptable if the flyer stated, 'Land owners have advised the PC they want to develop and build houses on two separate sites in the village. Then the flyer should have continued by saying it (the PC) wanted the opinion of the villagers BEFORE considering and commenting on these developments'. That is all. That would have been very clear and unambiguous and maintain the PC's neutrality.

There are other assumptions that are not borne out by the evidence. <u>Housing needs.</u> There are no housing needs in the village. Council house tenants wanting to live here have had no problem. Graveley is not attractive for council tenants, especially those on restricted income. There are no facilities, shops, buses or surgery for those that live here. There is a pub, but no other recreational facility at all. Families living in Graveley will, realistically, need two cars. It is a fact it is the norm for the bread winner to leave to village, by car, to work elsewhere and shopping, school trips, etc, will need the use of a further vehicle by their partner. The same would apply to 'low cost' or 'first time buyers' coming to the village. Having unused or unrented housing in the village could, possibly and I hope theoretically, encourage their use for the council housing 'difficult families' away from problem areas in nearby towns.

As for people 'downsizing', the same problems arise. As people get older they need to be near facilities. Graveley is NOT a retirement village. It is a middle income dormitory village with residents working and playing elsewhere. My wife and I are very aware the downsizing option is not, currently, open to us.

<u>Natural growth.</u> The SCDC local plan has no specific plans for growth of small villages like Graveley. The assumed growth, as stated in the flyer, is based on a developer wanting to develop a site for individual profit and not, I suggest, on hard evidence or council planning. There is nothing wrong with developers making a profit but the developer(s) should be honest and not hide behind such nonsensical and facile expressions like 'natural growth'. There is no demand for further housing here; if anything the opposite is true. There are people living in the village who want to move but cannot. The houses currently up for sale are not selling. If further housing is built in Graveley it will not only make it harder for existing vendors to sell, it will depress the value of existing houses even further than the devaluation already caused by the wind farm. The village will be further 'blighted'.

I also note the comment in the final sentence of the first paragraph about planning. It is well known a vague proposal before any planning application is made is not worth the paper it is written on. Any open agreement, in principle and not verified, by anyone or authority, to a potential development without proper drawings (drawn up and approved and signed by an architect) is an 'open sesame' for any 'less than scrupulous' developer to totally ignore it and submit any plan he wants...or thinks he can get away with. Negotiations for compromise will NOT be with the village, but with remote planning departments who live by the rule book. This book is also very well read and understood by developers.

The Parish council will have no control over the developments and should not have aligned itself with the land owner(s) for this flyer. The PC should, I respectfully suggest, have carried out a simple referendum <u>on its own</u>. If the landowners want to influence the referendum they should produce their own flyers and canvass the villagers themselves openly and honestly.

Back to the questions.

There are about 75 houses in the Parish. To consider the building of a minimum of 18 houses is NOT a small development. That is a massive 24% increase!

Manor Farm.

The corner from High Street into Papworth Road is very dangerous. The land owner should have proposed a considerable realignment of the road and a pavement on the High Street and down the Papworth Road before considering development of the site for housing.

To put 12 houses on the proposed site is a very high number for the village to accommodate. I do not think, however, it would stay at 12. The temptation to build more, possibly 20, on the site, would be difficult to resist for some developers.

The problems of drainage, sewage and other utilities would add extra strain on the limited resources in the village now.

Also the development of the barn or rebuilding of a 13^{th} cent house are red herrings. One cannot build a new 13^{th} century house!

Finally the wind farm would be very visible at just 1200 metres away and, if young children are housed in the development, it could raise problems caused by shadow flicker and AM noise. There is also increasing evidence of LFN (Low Frequency Noise) causing medical problems.

Toseland Road.

I can understand the development of the current industrial units and normally I would not object to this, if done sympathetically. I would, however, much prefer to vote <u>after</u> seeing a properly drawn plan of the proposal. However, I do doubt the wisdom of the developer considering 6 houses here for many reasons. They would be crammed in and would, probably, be out of keeping with the existing housing stock in the road.

Further to that there are severe problems with noise and shadow flicker from the wind farm to the Toseland Road area, where the development site is located. The industrial unit across the road is very active and often noisy.

Wind Farm effect

I think the financial risk of any development in Graveley, with the ongoing and well known problems from the wind farm, is unacceptably high and uninsurable. The council (SCDC) I cannot imagine will allow itself to be made liable if planning approval is given for either site. The risk of liability for problems (Physical, medical and financial) emanating from the wind farm alone will be far too high to accept.

Then there is the problem of devaluation of existing properties. I cannot see anyone actually wanting to buy the houses with the wind farm so close and so obviously there. With several houses in the village on the market for well over a year in a county where house prices, generally, are rising is very telling on the immediate local market in the villages around the wind farm.

Mortgage lenders are increasingly aware of the financial risk of property values near wind farms. They are aware, as we all are; the value of anything is totally dependent on the amount of money someone else will pay for it. Some would, somewhat cynically, say the houses in Graveley are, in light of the current evidence, technically worthless.

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
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
