

## INFRASTRUCTURE FUNDING STATEMENT 2019/2020

## Introduction

Planning obligations under Section 106 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, commonly known as "section 106 agreements", are a mechanism used to make a development proposal acceptable in planning terms. They are focused on site specific mitigation of the impact of development by way of either the direct provision of infrastructure (both on and off site of the development) and through the payment of financial contributions to the local planning authority.

South Cambridgeshire District Council secures contributions in relation to infrastructure which it will deliver but also on behalf of third parties including Parish Councils and NHS England. This will typically comprise contributions towards sports, children's play, village halls, allotments, health centres, and household waste bins. Cambridgeshire County Council secures contributions in relation to infrastructure including schools, libraries, highways, and household recycling centres.

Reporting on developer contributions helps local communities and developers see how contributions have been spent and understand what future funds will be spent on, ensuring a transparent and accountable system.

In accordance with the Community Infrastructure Levy Regulations any authority that receives a contribution from development through the Community Infrastructure Levy or section 106 planning obligations must prepare an infrastructure funding statement.

This infrastructure funding statement relates to contributions secured and received by South Cambridgeshire District Council for the reported year 2019/20. There are a small number of instances where the District Council will secure contributions on behalf of the County Council and information relating to these are provided for in this document, however, in the main Section 106 information relating to Cambridgeshire County Council will be set out in their own infrastructure funding statement.
